It's all about Search & Rescue and about proper equipment for this objectives. The uniqueness of this course is the complex program that encloses the use of different kinds of boats, to form rescuers with basic knowledge to deal with various emergencial situations. The course lasts three days, and is characterized by a very intensive program. It is required to own a valid license of Whitewater Technician Rescuer 1 to have access to this course.

During the first day, the main techniques of navigation on raft, both with motor and paddle, will be explained and enhanced. The second day regards kataraft navigation techniques with oars and motor. The third and last day is mainly characterized by navigation tests, with paddle, oars and motor, with proper rescue maneuvers to deal with any kind of emergency.

The course is held by highly qualified teachers who are specialized in rescue and emergency staff formation, Rescue Project instructors are rafting teachers with Rescue Project School specialization on motors and oars, the school is recognized as Italian River and Flood Salvation School for rescuers' formation, thanks to its high standards in matter of instructors' choice and its many recognitions. By the end of course, participants will have acquired extended knowledge of rescue techniques on boats, both with and without motor.


